Notifications

On the upper left hand corner you will find a section notifying you who is following you, has sent you pins, or any other general activity.

Pinterest Feed

The "feed" is a collection of pins from pinners or boards you follow.

Personal Boards

This is your personal collection of folders called "Boards."



Public Boards

Viewable to anyone with an account; must be invited to pin.



Create New Boards

Categories



Categories show you all pins that relate to a certain topic like Food & Drink or Events. When you create a board, tell Pinterest what category it falls under.



Secret Boards

Allows you to hide your pins from the feed and other followers.



Collaborators



Description

The board description can identify the contents or theme of your pins, or it can be a place to house assignment directions.



Pinning

Following

"Following" a board or pinned will place the things you pin on their feed.


Inviting

"Inviting" a person to your board allows them to pin to that board. Invites can be via email address when the board is created, using the invite button, or through "edit board."



From Pinterest

The simplest way to add pins is search for existing pins on Pinterest.



From a Device

To add a website outside of Pinterest either type in the web address or use the "pin button" which can be added to your browser.



From the Web

You may upload your personal photos from your phone or tablet.



Liking/Sending

"Liking" a pin will save it to no specific board. "Sending" a pin allows you to share a pin with another follower. You may also attach a message.
